THROUGH RATES

New in Effect from Texas Points to the Atlantic Seaboard.

Joint supplement No. 13 to Joint Interstate Freight Tariff No. 4, just issued, effects quite an innovation in freight rates from Texas points to the Atlantic seaboard. Under the new disposition, which is now in effect, the authorized rates applicable from points in seaboard territory to Texas stations will also apply between, in other words, Texas will henceforth have through rates to the seaboard in lieu of sums of local, which has been in vogue heretofore. The following changes and conditions are also noted in the supplement:

Cotton piece goods as follows: Calicoes, Canton flannels, plain or dyed, canvas, coarse jeans, cotton plaid, cottonades, cotton wrap, cotton yarn, crash (linen or cotton), domestic checks, drapes, and chevrons, cotton duck, denim, drills, domestic flannels, glazed cambrics, oaksburgs, sheetings, bleached and brown, shirtings, tickings, window holland and shade cloth, plain, uncut or undecorated, cotton jeans, cotton shirtings in bags, 2 1/2, 3, 3 1/2, or in boxes, any quantity. (Circular Item No. 17) less than car loads, 1; to Texas common points, less than car loads, 1.2.

All dry goods, except the articles above specifically named, will be classified as "Dry Goods, N. O. R." Any package containing articles of more than one class will be charged at the tariff rate for the highest classed article contained therein.

WESTERN CLASSIFICATIONS

Ballots Made by the Committee in Session at Chicago.

The following rulings have been made by the western classification committee, and will govern until the issue of classification No. 22:

Barbers' mirror cases. Same as dressing cases. (See page 23, classification No. 22). The mirrors are ratable separately as mirrors.

Butter, tins, in packages containing three or more tins completely nested with the cover outside, fully secured, fastened. Same as butter tins, nested in bundles. (See page 19L, classification No. 22).

Car load rating of third class will apply on all rates suggested under heading "Cornice and Bracket," on page 22, classification No. 22.

Human hair, including wigs and wigs, etc. Liquid core compound, for country make. Same as coal lumps. (See page 23, classification No. 22).

Pickle display stands (wooden), with jars included.

Real estate, the property of an intending settler and not intended for sale or disposition, may be shipped with emigrant movables at emigrant movables rate.

Tin and coffee, in barrels with cloth tops. O. R. D. 1.

Tin foil scrap. Same as tin scrap. (See page 23, classification No. 22).

Of Ballington Booth's Volunteers Held in New York.

New York, April 26.—The first big rally of the Volunteers in New York held Carnegie hall last night. The strength of Ballington Booth's new organization showed on the stage with more than two hundred of New York citizens, soldiers and a band.

When Commander and Mrs. Booth appeared on the platform the audience rose and gave a hearty cheering, which was only hushed when it became evident that Ballington Booth desired to speak. His first words were: "I am very pleased once again after all that Mrs. Booth and I have been called upon to pass through to find myself at last here face to face with my fellow countrymen."

This led to more applause and cheers. Booth spoke of the suffering they had endured and added with it came a sense of justice which "arose from pain and kept the heart from breaking."

Of the difficulties ahead she expressed no fear. She recalled the navigator who, when asked if he knew the rocks, cried, "No! but I know the course." She said: "We know the course, for we feel God is guiding us. We are therefore not afraid."
