Austin, Texas, January 20.—The Ward election bill is one of the features of the prospective legislation which the Twenty-fifth legislature has in hand and is causing considerable interest.

Senator Dashiell's bill, introduced in the senate, amending the law in relation to attachments for witnesses in criminal cases, makes the provisions to be complied with more strict than formerly.
