A VISIT TO THE JAIL.

A Post Representative Called on Three Prisoners Yesterday. AN INTERVIEW WITH ALEX TERRELL

He Wants to Reform and Hopes to Go to Heaven—Underwood and Williams Had Nothing to Say.

Three cells in the county jail are occupied by three persons each of whom has passed before a jury of twelve and received the sentence of death, but upon only one has the judge passed the sentence "to hang by the neck until dead."

Terrell was first visited. He is under sentence of death, April 2 being fixed as the date when he is to be executed for one of the worst crimes in the calendar, that of criminal assault. He is in down cell No. 8, in compartment No. 5 of the jail.

Ed Underwood was next spoken to. He is in upper cell No. 4. Ed says he is not guilty and that is the victim of a put-up job. When Burger was mentioned, Ed used language that would not look well in print and remarked that he would like to be put in the same cell with Burger.

Lewis Williams is in cell No. 4, lower, just below Underwood. He is suffering with rheumatism and lay upon his cot smoking a cob pipe. Lewis had little to say, except that he is innocent of the murder.
