

BUDGET FROM BRENHAM

WASHINGTON COUNTY TREASURY A FLOURISHING CONDITION.

Epidemic of scarlatina is noted at Chappell Hill—Smallpox Patient is Recovering.

Brenham, Texas, September 1.—Charles East, treasurer of Washington county, occupies the unique position of "long" in his accounts to the amount of \$100 and more. In other words, he is the custodian of school funds to that extent that have accumulated the past years by reason of a discrepancy in the manuscript and the scholastic enrollment. This fund has come in for a full attention lately at the hands of newspapers and others, and the fact of condition of the county finances has been the means of securing for Treasurer East some well-earned compliments. In fact, he is one of the few county treasurers to surprise his constituents by making showing of larger funds on hand than was expected. The report of Treasurer East for the fiscal year ending August 31 shows the following: Balance carried forward and on hand September 1, 1898, \$18,796.28; received from State for years 1898-1899, \$2,389.50; school lands for years 1898-1899, \$17,410.00; \$52,637.18 out for years 1898-1899, \$4,259.00.

Balance on hand September 1, 1899, \$18,796.28. This amount is on deposit with the First National bank of this city as shown by the certificate of Cashier H. K. Harrison, County Health Physician T. O. Hynes.

On the afternoon of September 1, 1899, Chappell Hill had scarlatina in epidemic form. It is reported that twenty-eight cases of the malady are at present being treated by physicians there. Dr. Hynes at once took steps to secure more definite information regarding the condition of affairs at Chappell Hill, which are scheduled to begin on next Monday.

In conversation with City Health Physician T. O. Hynes this morning, that functionary said to a Post reporter that the smallpox patient who was reported to have died since the secondary fever commenced on Sunday, and every effort will be made to relieve all forms of the disease before it is allowed to go beyond the first stage.

I put out the scarlet fever flag at Tom Hillman's residence this morning. His daughter being the patient. It is a mild case, requiring the same precautions as measures as serious cases. It has been asked if it would be advised for the public schools to open Monday, which I reply that I think there is no danger of spreading the disease. It is not so apprehend the least danger of an epidemic, and I fear no danger whatever from the smallpox case. I do not think it is necessary to take any special precautionary measures that have been and are still being enforced.

William Buechler is reported considerably improved today. He has been in the hospital for two months. His condition is reported as serious. Dr. Hynes has been appointed clerk for the Houston and Texas general railway.
