LIVELY FIGHT ON PLATFORM
But Democrats Finally Adopt One and Then Adjourn

SUFFRAGE PLANK CAUSES EXCITEMENT
Substitute Offered by Minority Committee Finally Voted Down After Lively Session—Vermont Delegation Voted Solidly Against Substitute.

ST. LOUIS, June 17.—The Democratic national convention finished its work yesterday afternoon by adopting the party platform exactly as approved by President Wilson and submitted by the resolutions committee, including the plank on Americanism and that favoring woman suffrage, but not until the harmony of its three days' stay had been disturbed with a row over the suffrage plank.
No voice was raised against the vigorous declarations of the Americanism plank, but at one time it looked as if the suffrage plank had been lost.

KNIGHTS TEMPLAR IN LOS ANGELES
33d Triennial Conclave Marks the Centennial Anniversary of the Order in United States.

LOS ANGELES, June 17.—Los Angeles welcomed today thousands of delegates arriving to attend the 33d triennial conclave, which is also being celebrated as the centennial anniversary of the Knights Templar of America. Scores of informal receptions to the visitors were held during the day. The formal opening of the convention, however, will be held tonight in the form of an impressive reception to Sir Lee S. Smith of Pittsburgh, acting grand master. The conclave will close next Saturday.

Practically all commanderies in the United States jurisdiction, including Alaska, Honolulu and the Philippines will be represented. Representatives from the grand priorities of Canada and Ireland and a Masonic delegation from Mexico were expected.

AMERICANS WOUNDED IN WAR.
Ambulance Workers in France Injured by Shell Fragments.
PARIS, June 17.—Fred Hollinshed of Sparta, N. J., and Jacob Wendell, members of the Norton unit of the American Ambulance, have been wounded by fragments of a shell. The former, who is a member of the Harvard club, was injured in the arm, although not seriously. Wendell was struck in the back. His condition is not dangerous. They were taken in an ambulance to Bras, southwest of Fort Donnau, near Verdun, on Tuesday, and are now at the American Ambulance hospital at Neuilly.
