THE SALE OF NORFOLK COLLEGE RATIFIED.

The stockholders of the Norfolk College held a meeting last night and ratified the action of the board of directors in selling the property to Captain John L. Roper.

The sum at which the property was sold is not given. The incumbences upon the college are heavy, and Captain Roper, who was the principal owner before, assumes all these, consequently the price paid was low.

With the meeting last night the Norfolk College Company passes out of existence. The stockholders attended to several matters incident to the closing of the college and the dissolving of the company. The details of the settlement of the college matters now pass into the hands of Captain Roper.

It is to some extent problematical as to what will be done with the college property by Captain Roper. As has been stated before in this paper he has rented one-half of the building to parties, who will erect business houses upon it sometime in the future.
