### WHOLESALE GROCERS.

NORFOLK'S DELEGATES TO SOUTHERN WHOLESALE GROCERS' MEETING.

The Wholesale Grocers' Association of Norfolk will be represented at the meeting of the Southern Wholesale Grocers' Association at Asheville, N. C., by Mr. H. B. Goodridge and Mr. M. L. T. Davis.

They will leave for Asheville next Tuesday night. The association will discuss the matter of the recent combinations of capital in the shape of trusts. These trusts affect the wholesale grocers by reason of the fact that in many places these trusts have reduced their number of selling agents and appointed their own agents. This directly affects the wholesale grocers all over the country. The trusts have organized systems of selling and the wholesalers now recognize the fact that they must organize a more perfect system of buying in order to protect their own interests.

Another important matter is that of the competition of Arbuckle Brothers with the Sugar Trust, which in some States, has broken down the restricted selling price in sugars so that the wholesale grocers in those States have been compelled to sell sugars below cost because the competition has been so severe between the refiners of the Sugar Trust and Arbuckle Brothers that these parties have both, in some States, inaugurated the practice of selling directly to the retail dealers.

There will be a discussion of the maintenance of contract prices and the enforcement of penalties for the violation of contracts, and a discussion of means for making local associations more effective.

The meeting will be in session for three days. It is expected that there will be present between two hundred and three hundred delegates, covering all of the Southern States, and that important action may be taken in some of the matters noted above.
