PETERSBURG.

Charged With Feloniously Assaulting Citizen of Norfolk.

Mr. John O. Thurman the Victim of a Violent Negro—Working For the Battlefield Park—Work of an Incendiary.

Petersburg, Va., Sept. 26.—The Hustings Court met, pursuant to adjournment, this morning, when the case of the Commonwealth against John Carter, colored, charged with feloniously assaulting John O. Thurman, of Norfolk, with a beer-bottle, was called for trial. The accused was represented by Hon. Wm. B. McIlwaine and Major Francis R. Lassiter. The prosecution was conducted by the attorney for the Commonwealth, Mr. Charles Trotter Lassiter, assisted by Mr. Wm. R. McKenney. The trial had not been concluded when this report closed. Shortly after the alleged assault was committed by Carter he had an examination before the Mayor, by whom he was sent on for trial, and was released on bail for his appearance, in the penalty of \$2.50. Carter jumped his bond and went to Boston, where he was arrested.

ON THE APPOMATTOX.

Petersburg, Va., Sept. 26.—Every effort is being made to induce the government to approve the scheme of establishing a national military park to embrace many of the famous battlefields near Petersburg. A former Secretary of War had become so much interested in the matter that he promised to send a skillful engineer here to look over the fields, and to make report and recommendations as to the feasibility of the scheme. During a visit to Washington last week, Congressman Sidney P. Epes called upon Secretary of War Root and discussed the matter with him. The Secretary seemed much interested in the project, and promised Mr. Epes to send very shortly a representative of the War Department to Petersburg to report upon the feasibility and expediency of establishing this park. Much may depend on this report, but the matter will be brought to the attention of Congress next Winter, and vigorously urged. Around Petersburg are the scenes of many of the fiercest conflicts of the war.

COLORED RECRUITS.

A batch of fifteen colored recruits, who have passed a satisfactory examination, will be sent from this city in a day or two to Camp Meade, Pa., for enlistment in the Forty-seventh Regiment, now forming there to go to the Philippines.

ACCIDENTALLY SHOT.

James Hix, of this city, who was a soldier in the late Spanish-American war, was seriously shot this afternoon while hunting in Dinwiddie county. He tried to hang his gun on the limb of a tree by the trigger, not knowing the gun was cocked. The pressure on the trigger caused the hammer to fall, lodging the lead in his left hand and whole length of the left leg and lower part of the abdomen.

AN INCENDIARY'S WORK.

The stables and barns of R. S. Lockett, in Prince George county, were destroyed by fire about midnight Monday night, with a lot of fodder, corn and farming implements. Three horses were burned. Loss, \$1,000. The fire was of incendiary origin.

NEWPORT NEWS.

TROPHY SHOOT—TO WED—MILITIA INSPECTION.

Newport News, Va., Sept. 26.—The Chesapeake Gun Club is making extensive arrangements for its annual trophy shoot at Riverview Park on the afternoon of Wednesday, October 4th. The club now has a membership of forty-five and among its members are to be found a number of expert shots. Every Wednesday afternoon at Riverview Park the Nimrods have contests for the Stearnes' gold medal. Usually the attendance at these weekly shoots is very good and some excellent scores are made.

There will be quite a number of fine prizes offered in the annual trophy shoot. The merchants of the city are donating liberally for the collection of trophies and by the latter part of this week it is probable that the club will be able to make a fine display. The trophies will be put on exhibition in the store of Marston & James several days prior to the shoot.
