Raleigh, N. C., Oct. 2.—One of the smoothest swindling schemes unearthed in many a day came to light here yesterday when a United States postal detective, Mr. Fulton, called in the Secretary of State's office to find if a charter had ever been granted a concern known as the Alaska-Klondyke Improvement Company.
