REVIEW OF MARKETS

FINANCIAL AND COMMERCIAL

Stocks, Money, Exchange, Bonds, Grain, Cotton, Provisions, Etc.

New York, October 10.—The stock market to-day demonstrated in a striking manner its reliance on the domestic money situation and its indifference to the events in foreign lands.

The local market responded only partially to the improved quotations from abroad and more than lost the opening gains before the end of the first hour.

The gains ranked from 1 to over 2 per cent in many active stocks. The buying was undoubtedly in large part due to the covering of short contracts by the bear interest, which has been considerably extended during the last few days on the continuing appearance of money stringency.

The speculative industrials were most unaffected, including those in the metal industry. The most notable movement in the railroad list was that of C. B. Q., which rose an extreme 2 1/2.
