FACTS ABOUT RUSTS.
THE PAPER TRUST EVIL AND THE REMEDY.
(From the Fulton Sun.)

When the Sun, early in the present year, unfurled the banner, "A Poe to Trusts," and enlisted its little influence with the opposition to corporate greed, we had no thought of personal interest.

We took an advance position against trusts because we saw the approach of oppression to the toiling masses, and because we believed it was dangerous for our form of government for wealth and corporate greed to have it in their power to control the supply and the price of needed commodities.

While our light one year ago was disinterested and unselfish, it is today a battle for our very life. When we began the fight we saw no danger to our business, but to-day the great paper trust threatens to gobble up all the life-printing plants, and our fight is now a fight for life, a battle in self-defense.

In 1899 the white paper the Sun is printed on cost us \$1,360. In 1900 the same paper (same in quality and same amount) will cost us, at present prices, \$2,180, a difference of \$820 in the cost of one item, white paper.

At the annual meeting of the stockholders of the International Paper Company the secretary reported "four idle mills in the United States owned by us, thirty-five working mills owned by us. The company owns in all, or leases, 1,000,000 acres of wooded land in Vermont, New Hampshire and New York accessible to these mills." They also have leases on two thousand square miles of timber in Canada.
