

A Cure for Appendicitis.

Editor The Virginian-Pilot:

Sir:—I have read with some degree of interest an editorial announcement printed in an afternoon paper, to the effect that a New York physician has discovered a new cure (?) for appendicitis, without the use of medicines or the scalpel.

The appendix vermiformis is a long (or short), narrow, twisted tube, the rudiment of the prolonged caecum in A.L. mammalia. It terminates in a blunt extremity. Its mucous membrane is continuous with that of the caecum, and contains many solitary glands.

The appendix is situated normally in the right iliac fossa, which, of course, is considered inside of the abdominal cavity. The psoas magnus muscle takes its origin from the sides and anterior surfaces of the last dorsal, and all the lumbar vertebrae and the intervertebral substances, between them; and is inserted into the lesser trochanter of the femur (or thigh bone). Its action is to flex and rotate the thigh outward, likewise flexes the trunk and pelvis on the thigh.

There is probably no disease either in surgery or medicine so deceptive and treacherous as is appendicitis, so I am glad a new (?) remedy is at hand.
