Forthcoming Session of Sovereign Grand Lodge, I. O. O. F.

Officers of the Grand Lodge of Virginia Visit Norfolk—The Junior Order United American Mechanics—Notes of Interest Concerning Local Fraternities.

Mr. William A. Bailey, grand master, and Mr. Hill Montague, grand representative of the Grand Lodge of Virginia, I. O. O. F., officially visited Norfolk, Va. on Friday night. Arrangements for properly entertaining the Sovereign Grand Lodge of the World, which meets in Richmond next September, were discussed, and the assurance of the co-operation of Norfolk Odd Fellows in entertaining the visitors to our Capital City was given.

Mr. Bailey, in an address, reviewed the work of the Grand Lodge in Virginia since 1899. Twenty-one new lodges have been instituted, besides several lodges of the degree of Rebekah, and from 1,000 to 2,000 have been made to the membership.

Mr. Montague also spoke entertainingly of the forthcoming meeting of the Sovereign Grand Lodge. He said that some 500 of the officers and representatives in attendance on this session would be brought to Norfolk on a special train to visit points of interest in this section. Arrangements have been made with the Monticello Hotel to serve an elaborate lunch, and with the Chamberlin at Old Point for supper.

At the meeting of the Norfolk Lodge representatives of sister lodges made short speeches for the good of the order.

BISHOP JACKSON.

BROW OF BISHOPS ACCEPT HIS RESIGNATION.

The New York Herald of yesterday says:

In session called for that special purpose, the House of Bishops of the Protestant Episcopal Church, which met yesterday in the Church Mission House, in Fourth avenue, accepted the resignation of the Right Rev. Henry A. Jackson, Bishop of Alabama. The debate, concerning whose conduct many rumors have been rife, gave ill health as a reason for his resignation.

There were present at the meeting forty-seven of the thirty-seven bishops in the United States. The session was called by Bishop Clarke, of Rhode Island, who, as presiding Bishop, had received the resignation of the Rev. Dr. Jackson. The venerable Bishop of Rhode Island was unable to be present, however, and Bishop Whitney, of America, The Right Rev. Dr. Jackson's resignation raised the question as to whether the House of Bishops should accept or leave it for such action as the General Convention might take. It was found that the House of Bishops, according to the canon of the Church, might accept a member's resignation, provided it was offered more than six
