Stocks, Money, Exchange, Bonds, Grain, Cotton, Provisions, Etc.

These Are Closing Sales Each Day.

New York, Aug. 15.—To-day's stock market was in many respects a counterpart of the early trading of the week. There was, however, more uniformity to the advancing tendency, exceptions being limited to only a few stocks. Money rates here to-day continued easy, but an easier tendency was noted in discount in London, which caused long sterling bills to harden here, and the posted figures were marked up 1/2 cent. The stock market in detail showed conspicuous strength in many quarters, with a tendency for special stocks influenced by rumors. Brooklyn Rapid Transit started up two points on the reported favorable character of its pending annual statement, but the announcement late in the day that the report would not be published for several weeks wiped out pretty much all that rise. Railroad stocks, particularly the granitic group, received good support. Sugar, People's Gas and Consolidated Gas were conspicuous features in the market at different times, but in only the latter was there any material effect left of the demand, net gain of 3 1/2 points being registered. Movement abroad was reported to be more favorably inclined toward American rails, and London took almost 10,000 shares of stock.

Merchandise business was transacted in railroad bonds to-day than for some time, and there was a decided upward tendency for some issues, particularly Atchison Adjustments, St. Louis Southwestern 2's and Wash. debentures. Total sales for value \$10,000,000. U. S. 4's and the 5's advanced 1/4 in the bid price. Total sales of stocks to-day were 338,000 shares.

NEW YORK COTTON MARKET. New York, Aug. 15.—The market for cotton futures opened barely steady, with prices 1 to 6 points lower, and generally weak during the forenoon. At the lowest point of the forenoon prices were six to eight points under the closing of last night, making the net loss since Monday night 22 to 29 points. At midday, however, began to manifest unsteadiness owing to the apparent oversold condition of the market and belief that the long interest had been pretty well eliminated. From a feeling of nervousness, shorts subsequently became positive, frightened, and were soon in full rout. On the upturn the forenoon loss was not only recovered, but a considerable portion of yesterday's decline was wiped out. During the balance of the session the market was extremely feverish, with a tolerably firm undertone. The close was steady, with August 1 point; other months 5 to 8 points higher.
