VIRGINIA LEADS,
WHAT CHAUNCEY M. DEPEW SEES IN THE SOUTH.
THE BONONZA OF THE FUTURE
The Resources of Most Other Sections Have been Developed—But Such is not the Case Here—The Trust Only Has Been Broken.

Chauncey M. Depew seems to have reached the core of the situation, and stated it so positively that it needs no effort to comprehend it. The natural resources of the North, East and West have been drawn upon until they now yield no attractive values. The day of big things has passed. It is to the South, kept back by circumstances which could not be well avoided, that the capital and energy of the country are looking. It is here where accumulations of years in the enterprises of the North and West, must find profitable employment. And who were under the impression that the South was more inviting. While Mr. Depew does not specially mention Virginia in his reference to the South, it is because he has never traversed the State and investigated her resources. Of all the States in the Union she is richest in material resources. Not even Pennsylvania, in her virgin days, could surpass her in minerals, in timbers, in clays, and agricultural possibilities. We venture nothing in saying that the iron and resources of this State are unequalled in the Union, and yet we have comparatively no industries to represent them. It is only in recent days that capital and skilled knowledge have been attracted to this section. And it is the more that such marvelous wealth has so long lain dormant.
