ROANOKE WINS THE VISITORS WERE SNOWED UNDER YESTERDAY.

The Phoebus base ball club, of Hampton, Virginia, arrived in the city yesterday morning and crossed bats with the Roanokes at the usual hour in the afternoon. The game was an interesting and exciting one, and despite the fact that the Roanokes won by a score of 7 to 1, the visitors exhibited baseball facilities which playing bespoke their efficiency. Their every movement was that of good players, and the reason why the contest wasn't closer is correctly attributed to the fact that they had traveled all night and were necessarily fatigued and worn out.

A good crowd was present, about 500 being there, and the game was of sufficient interest to keep them all there until it closed. Three of the features of the game were dog fights, which were greatly applauded. In the first inning the Roanokes failed to make a run. Rosenthal, of the visitors then went to the bat, and started everything, and made everybody yell until their throats got sore by knocking the ball over the fence, and making a home run. Brodie, the pitcher for the Roanokes, didn't get rattled, however, and it was due to him principally that no more runs were made in that inning by the visitors. In fact they made no more runs during the game.

In the second inning Sands knocked the ball safely to right field. Kirby got to third on errors, and then came home. Sands also on Alex Brodie's hit to left field.
