STATE NEWS. Items of Interest From All Parts of the State. William Edwin Johnson, a well known citizen and prominent Mason of Richmond, died Tuesday. The Democratic Congressional convention for the Seventh district of Virginia, will be held at Winchester August 7. The whole number of deaths in Richmond, last week, was thirty seven, of which fifteen were white and twenty-two colored.

The negroes of the Northern Neck have called a convention to meet the 21st of July, to map out a plan for their future action in political matters. By using the oyster resources intelligently Virginia may add immensely to her revenues and afford relief to the agricultural and other heavily burdened interests. The many friends of Hon. Basil J. Gordon, late chairman of the Democratic party, and the people of Virginia will rejoice to hear of his convalescence and early restoration to health.

Hon. E. P. C. Lewis, ex-minister to Portugal, last week reached Clark county on a visit to his brothers, and to see his land interests. He spent last winter and spring in Switzerland. It is said that Virginia will soon have in full operation comprehensive laws promoting and protecting systematic planting interests. Virginians are going into productive planting industries with zeal and intelligence. Mr. C. C. Crowder, the manager of Mr. R. A. Young's farm, in Prince George county, who was so severely injured by a Jersey bull on Saturday evening, died at an early hour yesterday morning from the effects of his injuries.

Mrs. Unger, wife of ex-Senator J. K. Tager, residing sixteen miles south of Berkeley Springs, W. Va., killed herself Wednesday. She retired to her room, attired herself in an evening dress, and after pinning a rose on her breast shot herself through the head. Danger from Coal Oil in Summer. A frightful succession of coal oil fatalities again compels attention to the fact that in hot weather the product of petroleum becomes increasingly dangerous. As the temperature rises at these periods, from the heaviest crude oil to the most volatile naphtha, expand rapidly and give off gas that mixed with the air, becomes explosive. When cold these fluids do not evaporate, and dealers in kerosene illustrate the safety of their high test illuminating oils by throwing a lighted match into a vessel filled with the article which they especially recommend. This can be done as long as a low temperature is carefully maintained, but the instant the temperature reaches the point where evaporation begins the danger threatens. Gas is generated and as it spreads abroad fills the vicinity with an explosive compound which coming in contact with fire, commences in flashing combustion with the body of the fluid, and an outburst of flame follows which it is almost impossible for any human agency to deal with.

This was undoubtedly the cause of the calamity to the tank steamer Han and Kurts, as it was of the similar catastrophe resulting in the destruction of the steam schooner Louis Backe a sea. The gasoline accident at Almond and Adams streets was of the same character, and was attributable, as were the others mentioned, to the effect of the hot weather on petroleum products. The accident to oil tank by lightning are due to the same agency, electricity exploding the gas generated from the oil, and the flash setting the tank on fire. It is difficult to imagine how these dangers can be provided against when the products of petroleum are of necessity stored in large quantities; but it is at least a plain requisite that the dangers should be recognized and understood, to the end that extraordinary care may be exercised during the summer season.—Philadelphia Telegraph.

Smugglers Exposed by Lightning. The vivid flashes of lightning during Wednesday night's storm exposed to keen-eyed customs officer one of the largest smuggling frauds known in the history of this port. The German tank steamship Energie was lying at Point Breeze, loading oil in bulk for Bremen and was almost filled, when Night Inspector William Lamond saw by the lightning hurrying men bringing large boxes of merchandise on deck, and lowering them to small boats lying along the steamship's side. Lamond slipped off his shoes and crept along the wharf. He climbed on the vessel and hid himself to see further developments. Heavy packages continued to come up from the ship's cabin to the deck, and slings were lowering it to the small boats, when Lamond, with lead pistol in hand, rushed on deck and succeeded in catching E. Ulrich, a boatman, who was in charge of the small boat. He was arrested and detained with the aid of the mounted police and locked up for the night. His companions ran away and hid on the Energie, and it was impossible to find them. Ulrich took the officers to a scow near by, on which there were forty cases of brandy, gin and champagne taken from the Energie. The customs cutter Tench Cox was sent to prevent the Energie from leaving the port, as she had already cleared, and to notify Capt. Fortman that he must explain how the liquor was gotten off his vessel. It is estimated that from \$90,000 to \$40,000 worth of liquors are smuggled every year from vessels lying in the Shenandoah river, there not being sufficient night men to cover the territory.—Philadelphia Record.

In Scotland the craze has assumed a popular form and lessons are given by the dozen as low as fifty cents to one dollar.
