

SALEM, Oct. 16.—[Special]—Despite the drenching rain Salem is fully awake and striving. Land sales, new railroads, and new enterprises are talked of everywhere you go. THE TIMES, over a year ago, predicted that Roanoke and Salem were destined to become twin cities like Minneapolis and St. Paul. Now there are evidences everywhere to prove that THE TIMES was correct. Salem has built in the last year 318 houses, and has spent for building purposes upwards of one million dollars. Each day the dummy is heard nearer Salem. When it is completed Roanoke and Salem will become practically one. It is a source of gratification to note the feeling of good will in Salem towards Roanoke. Roanoke is responding. THE TIMES is taking the lead in that respect, and before five years, all pulling together, will be made of the two the manufacturing center, not only of Virginia, but of the whole South. The streets on the south side of the river are being rapidly graded and macadamized. There is a large force at work every day. The Holstein Woolen Mills will soon be ready for the reel. 
