Rev. Dr. Tyree, who died here a short time ago, was at one period of his long and useful life pastor of the Baptist Church at Bedford City, the members of which are now arranging to place in that church a memorial tablet. A handsome marble tablet will also be placed in the Salem church.

Hollis Shaver, one of the most frequent habitués of the mayor's court, was before his honor yesterday charged with the violation of section 10. The evidence showed that David M. Carroll was driving into town in a wagon drawn by a somewhat thin horse, when this negro scamp commenced making fun at the rig, and when told to mind his own business, began cursing, and picked up a rock. He was forthwith arrested, and fined \$8.25, and in default jailed with the promise that he will be made to work on the streets, the mayor regretting that he could not order some punishment which would make him leave town.

In place of Mr. Zedlitz Herr Balleström, the leader of the center party in the reichstag, has gone to Hubertusstock to see the emperor by the special desiro of his majesty. Herr von Patkammer, formerly imperial minister of justice, is mentioned as successor to Dr. Bosse as secretary of state in the ministry of justice.

VIRGINIA NOTES.

At a conference of the M. E. Church, South, of Staunton, held Wednesday night, it was decided to erect a new building at a cost of \$20,000 in place of the one crushed by the snow last week.

The captain and crew of the schooner Betram L. Townsend, who abandoned their vessel in a sinking condition on the 17 instant, have arrived at Norfolk, having been taken on board of the British steamship Linnie Burrill.

In the course of his lecture at the Richmond Theatre Tuesday night, Mr. Wm. L. Royall was very severe on Captain Palmer, commander of the G. A. R. for his recent order in reference to the displaying of Confederate flags.

It is thought that Senator Daniel will accept the invitation of the State Democratic committee to be present at its meeting in Richmond on Thursday. The Senator has also accepted an invitation to address the general convention of ex-Confederates to be held in New Orleans, April 28th.

The Washington correspondent of the Alexandria Gazette says that Mr. W. P. Smith, of the first Virginia district, has been employed to superintend the copying of the names of the Virginians entitled to money under the direct land tax bill. It is said that there are about 90,000 names to be copied.

Governor Holt, of North Carolina, will be at the launching of the Raleigh at the Portsmouth navy yard, with his family and staff, to the number of twenty-two persons. Governor McKinney, family and staff, have also been invited, as well as the naval committee of the United States senate and house, and Secretary Tracy and staff.

The postoffice at Hunter's mills, Fairfax county, has been discontinued. Mail will be sent to Vienna.

The only case heard by the Court of Appeals yesterday was that of Hurt against Brooks, which was argued and continued.

The Grand Lodge of Odd Fellows of Virginia meets in Richmond, April 12th. The condition of the order in the State is very flourishing and there have been a number of additions to the lodges.

J. N. Carpenter died in Berryville Sunday last. He was a former professor in the University of Louisiana and from 1858 to 1880 a paymaster in the United States navy.

The arbitrator to adjust the disputed accounts between the executors of the will of Jefferson Davis, and D. Appleton & Co. have filed a report in New York in favor of the publishers.
