



REGISTRATION BOOKS.

Registrars Have Qualified and Are Ready for Work.

The special act of the Virginia legislature renewing the charter of Roanoke requires that every voter in the city shall be registered before he will be allowed to vote.

The city has been divided into five wards as follows: The First ward embraces all that part of the city south of the Norfolk and Western railroad and west of Roanoke street. The Second ward is composed of that portion of the town south of the railroad between Roanoke and Jefferson streets. The Third ward lies north of the Norfolk and Western railroad and east of Henry street. The Fourth ward is bounded by the railroad on the north and Jefferson street on the west.

The Fifth ward embraces that part of the city north of the Norfolk and Western railroad lying west of Henry street; the boundary then runs with Henry street to Peach Tree street on the old Lynchburg and Salem turnpike, directly north to the city limits.

The registration books for each ward will be opened at sunrise April 25 and will be closed at sunset April 29. The registrars for the different wards and their offices are as follows: First ward, Peck Hotel, Salem avenue, Oscar Derr; Second ward, Junior Hose Company's engine house, corner Campbell and Roanoke streets, C. E. Watson; Third ward, Friendship Fire Company's building, J. L. Kelley; Fourth ward, market house, Tinsley Kindred; Fifth ward, Wertz's hotel, Park street and Third avenue, Thomas F. Barksdale.

The newly appointed registrars have been qualified by the electoral board and are ready to work. Under the general State law, the registration books will again be opened on the second Tuesday in May, which will be the last time any one wishing to vote in the municipal election will have an opportunity to register.

A registration directory has been printed by several candidates for city offices, stating that the registration books will be open from April 25 to the 30, inclusive. This is a mistake, as the law requires the books to be kept open only five days.
