


FIG. 1. FIG. 2.





Turn over again and draw each corner separately under toward the center, making a firm crease from center to each corner and from the center to the middle of each side where a fold comes. Now open out the little squares of paper made by the folding operation and the work is done, as seen in the fifth illustration. Stars for decorating can be cut by striking a circle, divide it into five equal parts, then pass a line from point to point as seen in illustration and cutting around outside the cross marks. Experiment till a satisfactory one is made, then use it for a pattern.—Farm and Home.
