Williamsburg is once more quiet and serene. The Roberts' open lecture and the big fire are both cool again.

So says the Newport News Herald. We all want a rest, and we are going to have it from now on we hope.

Says the Richmond News: "The corporation is not a supernatural thing. It is an organization of flesh and blood, dollars, and can be killed or driven away."

If the corporation has "flesh and blood" then it must have a heart. So, what liars many politicians must be!

According to reports from Richmond an attempt will be made to prevent the Legislature from appropriating money to erect buildings at the hospital here. Dr. Le Cato will lead a fight for using the money for establishing a colony for epileptics, there being in the several state hospitals about 200 of these afflicted. Such a colony should be established, but the state needs more hospital room very badly.

Never since the war has there been so strong a demand for farm lands in this section, and never before have prices advanced more steadily than at the present time. The real estate men, some of whom have spent and are spending hundreds of dollars annually to advertise our matchless resources, are responsible for the demand for property and the advance in real estate values.

THE HOSPITAL BOARD.

The following are the resolutions passed by the Board of the Eastern State Hospital:

After a full investigation of the cause leading to the fire which occurred in this hospital on the morning of Saturday, January 4th 1902, by which the main building known as "The Tower and Black Building" were destroyed, the Board of Directors are unable to determine how the fire originated, but find that the same did not originate through any fault or neglect on the part of any official or employee of the institution.

Resolved, That we desire to place on record our continued confidence in the faithfulness and capacity of the Superintendent and other officers and employees of this institution, and express our grateful thanks to the citizens of Williamsburg and officers and students of the College of William and Mary for the efficient and intelligent aid rendered in rescuing the unfortunate patients confined in this hospital, and to the President and Faculty of the said College for their offer of accommodations for the patients.

We further tender our thanks to the Chesapeake and Ohio Ry. Co. for its promptness in transporting stores and other necessities for the comforts of the inmates, and to Drs. Benj. Blackford and Ro. J. Preston, Superintendent of the Western and Southwestern State Hospitals, respectively, for their kind letters of sympathy, and to the latter for his offer to accommodate thirty or thirty-five male patients, and that his letter be made a part of this record. We tender special thanks to his Excellency, Governor A. J. Montague, for his prompt and efficient aid in forwarding necessary bedding etc. from Richmond, and for his attendance upon the meeting of the Board to-day and for his valuable

and courteous counsel during its session. In conclusion the Board calls attention to the fact that, out of a total of 136 male patients confined in these wards (comprising the worst class of patients in the Institution) 135 were saved, one, a Mr. Henry Driskell of Prince Edward county, Virginia, an epileptic dement, who it is supposed after being taken out to a place of safety, wandered back into the burning building and was suffocated.

The father of Mr. Driskell, we are informed by the Superintendent, was at once communicated with by telegraph and the remains were sent to his home for interment.

That even one life should have been lost is a source of deep regret to this Board, but they are filled with amazement and gratitude that the loss of life was not greater.
