

BIGAMIST WITZHOFF MEMBER OF VILLIANOUS MARRIAGE BUREAU

Woman Proves thrt Bigamist is Connected with the Matrimonial Syndicate that Preved upon Girls in Government Offices.

NEW YORK, Sept. 6.—The trail of Dr. George Witzhoff was taken up today by Charlotte Smith, president of the Woman's National and International league, with headquarters in Washington, and with a branch in this city.

Miss Smith saw in a picture published in a metropolitan newspaper a likeness to a man who attempted to marry a girl whom Miss Smith had rescued several years ago in Boston. She further recognized the picture as that of the man who married and deserted a young Washington widow now working in the Treasury Department in the national capital.

"I aided in reclaiming a girl in Boston about four years ago," said Miss Smith. "This girl our organization brought to this city and started in a hairdressing establishment. Her place was on Sixth avenue, near Fourteenth street. We had a call from her later. She said a man wanted to marry her and she was willing as he would invest some money in her shop. I warned her against this man, and she did not marry him. When I saw the newspaper picture of the man known as 'Dr. Frederick A. Schetzze,' who turns out to be Dr. Witzhoff in disguise, I immediately identified the picture as the man who attempted to marry our girl.

"A woman used to come to our Washington office two years ago trying to get facts about girls working in government offices. She asked so many questions concerning the financial standing of these girls that I wanted to know her reason for it. She told me she was getting from \$10 to \$15 a week from a syndicate of marriage brokers in New York, that she often used to don male attire and run about from town to town disguised in order to get her facts easier.

She said she kept for her employers tabulated lists, giving all the information she could gather about certain women in Washington and New York; just how much they had saved, how much their husbands left them, if they were young widows, and in fact everything that could be learned about the financial condition of marriageable women.

"One woman's husband had been dead about six months. He left her about \$5000 life insurance. A man was introduced to her through the marriage broker syndicate in New York city. She married him in a week's time and in two weeks he had all her first husband's money and had deserted her. After the desertion she showed me his picture. It is like the one of Dr. Witzhoff published today. The resemblance is such that there is no question that Witzhoff, as he is called married this Washington girl."

Miss Smith said she had been aware for years that there was a marriage syndicate working on the east side.

"This syndicate has men out who do nothing but marry girls," Miss Smith continued. "They have money to carry on a campaign with, and make large sums by the game. I am assured from our agents that in the United States if we could tabulate census of betrayed girls who have suffered from this game, we should easily find 50,000 women that in the last ten years have been married, robbed, and then deserted by them." Acting district Attorney Nott said today that there is a bench warrant calling for the arrest of Witzhoff on two indictments for bigamy, found in June, 1904, and in the hands of the detectives.

MOODY MOVES FOR PROSECUTION OF ACCUSED PACKERS

Cases Against Packers will be Called in October--First Contest to be Over Motions to Quash Indictments Returned by Grand Jury.

CHICAGO, Sept. 6.—Definite plans for the prosecution of the big packers under the indictments returned against them in July were made today at a conference between Attorney General Moody, Assistant Attorney Pugin and District Attorney Morrison.

The meeting between the attorney general, who is looked upon as the personal representative of President Roosevelt, and the attorneys who have been handling the case against the beef combine since it began with the inquiry by the federal grand jury, was held behind closed doors in the office of Mr. Morrison. None of the conferees would discuss what had taken place at the session, but the activity of the stenographers and attaches of the federal prosecutor's office was deemed significant.

Mr. Moody said: "I am in Chicago on the question of the packers. There is no use maintaining any secrecy about it. Since the case first came up I have, of course, some points that could be better discussed in a personal interview. That is why I am here. I will not under any circumstances discuss the merits of the case at the present time. To do so would be foolhardy and would exhibit poor judgment. Mr. Morrison will have plenty of talking to do when the case is on trial."

According to the plans of the federal prosecutor, the cases against the packers will be put on trial in the October term of court, and will be disposed of as quickly as possible. It is expected that the first task of Mr. Morrison will be to fight motions to quash all the indictments.


