WATERVILLE

Waterville, Nov. 2.—O. E. Giar, one of the proprietors of the sawmill and power plant at Entiat, spent a couple of days in town.

FIND DEFECTS IN NEW VOTING MACHINE.

CHICAGO, Nov. 1.—A dispatch to the Tribune from San Francisco says: The voting machines to be used at the coming municipal election were given a test yesterday before a committee representing the Fusionists, as it was claimed that it was possible to beat the machines. A linotype operator on a newspaper showed that by placing a small rubber band in certain place near the name of the Fusion candidate for mayor the machine would not register for mayor, though it would for all the other candidates.

An expert representing the machine company and half a dozen newspaper men were unable to make the machine register while the rubber band was in place.

HORRIBLY MANGLED UNDER MOVING TRAIN.

KANSAS CITY, Nov. 1.—Colonel T. A. Jackson, of Newton, Kas., chief of staff of the Kansas G. A. R., is dying at Agnew hospital in this city, the result of an accident last night at the union depot. Colonel Jackson attempted to board a moving train. He fell on his face and his arm was severed by the wheels of the car. His clothing then caught in the car trucks and his body swung around so that the rear wheels cut off both legs below the knee.

THE MURDER OF THE FIVE MISSIONARIES CONFIRMED.

NEW YORK, Nov. 2.—The Presbyterian board of foreign missions received a cablegram from Canton, China, telling of the murder of five American missionaries at the Presbyterian station at Lienchow, October 28, news of which was received in a dispatch to the Associated Press from Hong Kong yesterday. The cablegram to the board reads as follows: "Lienchow station has been attacked. Mrs. Machle, Aime Machle, daughter of Mrs. Machle, Mr. and Mrs. Peale and Dr. Eleanor Chestnut were killed. Dr. Machle and Patterson are safe. Buildings destroyed."

PROOF THAT LAD WAS TIED TO THE RAILROAD TRACK

Unfortunate Student Was First Chloroformed and Then Bound to Railroad Track Where He Was Crushed To Death by the Train.

MOUNT VERNON, OHIO, Nov. 2.—Buried beneath a culvert 200 feet from the spot where Stuart Pierson, the Kenyon college student, was ground to death by a train on Sunday, the authorities have found three lengths of blood stained rope and a wad of absorbent cotton, also saturated with blood.

County Prosecutor Stillwell expresses the firm belief that the boy was chloroformed, the cotton saturated, bound across his face, and that then he was tied across the tracks as a part of his initiation into a college fraternity. The authorities believe that the cotton was removed later and the boy left stupified. On these grounds the prosecutor will carry the case to the grand jury.
