## GENERAL CHAFFEE DISCUSSES THE EVILS OF DESERTION

WASHINGTON, Nov. 20.—General  
Chaffee's report to the secretary of  
war says that the army is under officer-  
ed. He declares that in time of war  
the army will be in decidedly cripple  
condition. He recommends legislation  
defining the political status of desert-  
ers and urges an aroused public senti-  
ment to the effect that deserting from  
the army be made repugnant to the  
minds of all good citizens as the only  
effectual means of material abatement  
of the crime.

## NEW KING TAKES TITLE

LONDON, Nov. 20.—A dispatch  
to the Exchange Telegraph Co. from  
Copenhagen says Prince Charles has  
decided to ascend the throne of Nor-  
way under the name of King Haakon  
and that his son will be known as the  
Crown Prince Olaf.

The official announcement of the  
name that Prince Charles will assume  
will not be known until he former-  
ly assumes the kingship. The corre-  
spondent at Copenhagen that the  
general opinion is that the king will  
be known as Carl V. rather than by  
the Norwegian name of Haakon.

## ENGINEERS DECIDE ON SEA LEVEL CANAL

WASHINGTON, Nov. 20.—The  
board of consulting engineers of the  
Isthmian canal commission today de-  
clared itself by a large majority in  
favor of a sea level canal. The con-  
clusion was reached after a long and  
careful study of the project.

Since the beginning of September  
the board had held meetings and in  
special sub-committees had studied  
the plans of a sea level canal with the  
greatest care.

A trip to the isthmus was made to  
enable the members to form a better  
idea of the physical difficulties which  
had to be considered.

The members of the board are men  
of the greatest reputation in the  
line of work. France Germany and  
Holland had sent their most eminent  
specialists at the request of this govern-  
ment.

No official statement will be given  
out before the commission reaches  
President Roosevelt, which will be  
about January 1.
