WASHINGTON, Nov. 20 .- The board of consulting engineers of the Isthmian canal commission today declared itself by a large majority in favor of a sea level canal. The conclaison was reached after a long and careful study of the project.

Since the beginning of September the board had neld meetings and in special sub-committees had studied the pans of a sea level canal with the greatest care.

A trip to the isthmus was made to enable the members to form a better idea of the physical difficulties which had to be considered.
