J. N. Hall of Denver gives a detailed study of 600 cases of heart disease seen by him in private practice. In many cases more than one lesion existed in a single individual. There were 444 organic valvular cases and ninety-two classified as myocarditis. The author gives a statement of the signs by which he made the diagnosis of each kind of valvular lesion. The mitral valve was affected 335 times, the aortic 54 times, tricuspid 13 times, the pulmonary 16 times. Causes included rheumatism, the predominant cause; chorea, scarlet fever, pneumonia, nephritis, tonsillitis and many other diseased conditions. Tobacco was the most frequent cause of functional diseases of the heart. In twenty cases of valvular disease in children a decided lack of growth was shown. The author emphasizes the importance of careful estimation of the muscular capacity of the heart as the guide in prognosis and therapeutics.
