**Wenatchee Autoists at Twisp.**

The first auto party to actually arrive within the city limits occurred last Saturday, when two cars came whizzing up the road and rounded the corner down one of the main streets to the astonishment of an unsuspecting public. The streets were well lined with people, and the automobiles each carrying a large party, were an imposing sight in the burg, out of the ordinary.

The two automobiles were those of W. E. Stevens, a Locomobile, and of W. W. Wenner, an E. M. F. In the party were W. W. Wenner and wife and son Leslie, W. E. Stevens and family, Graydon Stevens and wife, and G. W. Blair. The party had just arrived from Wenatchee, stopping at the Stevens and Wenner ranch on Benson creek over Friday night. After a short stop here they proceeded to Winthrop to see that section of the upper valley, and returned here well pleased with all they saw.

Messrs. Stevens and Wenner recently purchased the Oglesby ranches and the Hanson place. They started in the early spring improving the land and setting a large tract to orchard. The lands are irrigated from Benson creek by means of supplementary storage reservoirs, and it is the intention to materially raise the dams on the creek, storing a much larger quantity of water, making the irrigation of many additional acres possible.

The parties are well pleased with their purchase, and are enthusiastic about the country. They are from Wenatchee and have a thorough knowledge of the fruit industry.—Methow Valley News.
