New York

NEW YORK, Sept. 27.—Trading in stock today proceeded in a more orderly and rational manner, the sharp reversal of yesterday's final hour evidently having a sobering effect upon the more venturesome speculation element.

"The greater activity was shown in the first and final hours, the former being marked by a strong opening and sudden declines, while the lag end of the session was noteworthy for the strength of rally, some of which rose to best quotations of the last year of two.

Oil and Gas.

The 30-foot development on Dents Run, Mannington district, Marion county, W. Va., is furnishing the best production in the eastern fields.

On the J. L. Rex farm eight feet into the 30-foot sand and the hole filled up 1,000 feet with fluid. They are still drilling in the sand.

On Coon Run, McClellan district, Doddridge county, B. C. McIntyre & Company drilled a second test on the J. O. & G. C. Shradler farm through the Big Injun sand and it shows for a 25 or 30-barrel producer.

In the Weir sand territory, on Blue Creek, Elk district, Kanawha county, the Ohio Fuel Oil Company completed No. 3 on the Monteville Vancamp farm and it produced 40 barrels the first 24 hours.

On White Oak Creek, Washington district, Calhoun county, the Hope Natural Gas company drilled a test on the C. A. Jarvis farm through the Big Injun sand and found no oil, but a fair gas pressure.

On McCowan Creek, Walton district, Roane county, the Republic Oil and Gas Company's No. 16 on the Nancy C. Hively farm, is a 10-barrel pumper in the Big Injun sand.

The proposed amendment. That Section one of Article four of said Constitution as it now is be altered and amended so as to read as follows:

Section 1. The citizens of the State, both male and female, shall be entitled to vote at all elections held within the counties in which they respectively reside; but no person who is a minor or of unsound mind, or a pauper, or who is under conviction of treason, felony, or bribery in an election, or who has not been a resident of the state for one year, and of the county in which he or she offers to vote, for sixty days next preceding such offer, shall be permitted to vote while such disability continues; but no person in the military, naval or marine service of the United States shall be deemed a resident of this state by reason of being stationed there-in.

Those favoring the ratification of said amendment will vote "For ratification of Woman's Suffrage Amendment" and those opposing will vote "Against ratification of Woman's Suffrage Amendment."

CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT STATE OF WEST VIRGINIA.

A Proclamation: By The Governor. I, Henry D. Hatfield, Governor of the State of West Virginia, pursuant to the Constitution and laws of said state, do hereby proclaim, announcing to the voters of the state of West Virginia, that on the Tuesday next after the first Monday in November, in the year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Sixteen, there will be submitted for ratification or rejection an amendment to the Constitution of said state as follows, to-wit:

Proposed Amendment. That Section twenty-three of Article eight of said Constitution as it now is be altered and amended so as to read as follows:

Section twenty-three. The commissioners shall be elected by the voters of the county, and hold their office for the term of six years, except at the first meeting of said commissioners they shall designate by lot, or otherwise, in such manner as they may determine, one of their number who shall hold his office for a term of two years, one for four years and one for six years, so that one shall be elected every two years. But no two of said commissioners shall be elected from the same magisterial district. But if two or more persons residing in the same district shall receive the greater number of votes cast at any election, then only the one of such persons receiving the highest number of votes shall be declared elected, and the person living in another district who shall receive the next highest number of votes shall be declared elected.

The proposed amendment is designated as "County Court Amendment" and on the official ballot to be voted at said election will be printed the following:

BALLOT ON CONSTITUTIONAL COUNTY COURT AMENDMENT. Amending Section twenty-three of Article eight.

For ratification of County Court Amendment. Against ratification of County Court Amendment.

Those favoring the ratification of said amendment will vote "For Ratification of County Court Amendment;" and those opposing will vote "Against Ratification of County Court Amendment."

Given under my hand and the Great Seal of the state, at the Capitol, this seventh (SEAL) day of August, in the year of our Lord One Thousand Nine Hundred and Sixteen, and of the state the Fifty-fourth.

The proposed amendment is designated as "Woman's Suffrage Amendment" and on the official ballot to be voted at said election will be printed the following:

BALLOT ON CONSTITUTIONAL WOMAN'S SUFFRAGE AMENDMENT. Amending Section one of Article 4.

For ratification of Woman's Suffrage Amendment. Against ratification of Woman's Suffrage Amendment.

Those favoring the ratification of said amendment will vote "For ratification of Woman's Suffrage Amendment" and those opposing will vote "Against ratification of Woman's Suffrage Amendment."

Given under my hand and the great seal of the State, at the Capitol this eighth day of August, in the year of our Lord One Thousand Nine Hundred and Sixteen and of the State the Fifty-fourth.


