The wells in the Thirty-foot development on Dents Run, Mannington district, Marion county, W. Va., are making good records. The Delmar Oil company's No. 24, John Hays farm, is holding up at 740 barrels.

On the south fork of Hughes river, Murphy district, Ritchie county, the Hope Natural Gas company drilled No. 6 on the M. F. Parker farm through the salt sand and it shows for a 15-barrel pumper.

On the north fork of Hughes river, Clay district, the Carnegie Natural Gas company has a Big Injun gasser on the Hickman farm. On Slab run, Union district, the same company's test on the Creed Cox farm is dry in the same formation.

On the little Kanawha river, Sherman district, Calhoun county, the Hope Natural Gas company has drilled two tests on the G. Rice farm into the Big Injun sand and both were gassers.

ROBINSON VOTE WILL BREAK RECORD

Candidate Working Hard and No Disaffection in Party.

(Special Dispatch to West Virginian) CHARLESTON, W. Va., Oct. 3.—All signs fall Judge Ira E. Robinson, formerly of the supreme court of appeals, will be elected governor on November 7, by a larger majority than any candidate for governor was ever given in West Virginia, according to the Republican campaign managers.

"Vigilance is all that is needed," he said, "to bring about a much larger Republican majority than usual in West Virginia."

HEALTH HINTS

In spite of the millions of millions of them and their activity no one has ever seen a scarlet fever germ.

The reason for this is that as scarlet fever is not communicable to animals it is not possible to produce the disease at will, under conditions which can be controlled, and to study the life and actions of the germ.

The only known source of scarlet fever is a scarlet fever patient, from whom the germs in various ways pass to other persons and then set up the disease in those who are susceptible.

The scarlet fever patient is a source of infection from the moment that he begins to be sick until after complete recovery from every trace of inflammation in the throat, nose and ears. This sometimes takes much longer than the scabbing of the skin.

The germs are contained in the secretions of the throat, nose, mouth and ears. Wherever this material is deposited the germs are also deposited.

As the secretions are most profuse during the height of the attack, the patient is most dangerous at that time, but the danger is so great during the entire illness that measures to prevent the spread of the germ from the patient should at no time be neglected.
