WAR DEPT. TELLS ABOUT MILITARY REGISTRATION

Civil Authorities Will be in Complete Charge of It.

(By Associated Press) WASHINGTON, May 5.—An official outline of the method by which military registration is to be carried out under the selective conscription bill was made public today, with an appeal from the War Department for the voluntary services of state election and other officials in order that there will be no delay in enrolling and classifying millions of men for army duty.
