Pittsburgh

PITTSBURGH, May 14.—Prices declined on the Pittsburgh stock exchange last week, losses ranging from 1 to more than 6 points. At no time was there severe selling pressure, but demand was lacking, and the moderate amount of liquidation was accomplished only at the sacrifice of values.

On Saturday the market remained dull, but was somewhat firmer, although not much recovery in prices took place. The only exception was Manufacturers Light & Heat, which advanced from 64 to 65. Saturday's sales were as follows:

Will Come in Special Train to Make Social Call in Fairmont.


