## F.H.S. TRACK MEET OFFICIALS NAMED

Will Be Held at South Side Park Thursday.

Much inter-class spirit is developing for the annual high school track and field meet which will be held at South Side park Thursday afternoon. Each of the four high school classes will be represented with strong teams. A quarter of a mile track has been laid out at South Side park for the track meet.

Coach L. V. Carpenter this morning announced the officials for the meet as follows:

Starter, E. J. Hawkins.  
Judges, Harry Watkins and James Knight.

Timers, George Hill and Orin Bell.  
Announcer, Forrest Knight.  
Clerks, Herbert Hamilton, Orin Curtis and Brock Showalter.

Meet will start promptly at three-thirty and two events will be carried out at the same time as far as possible.

The following will be the order of the events at the inter-class meet to be held at the South Side park on Thursday of this week:

100-yard dash, pole vault, one mile run, shot put, 220-yard dash, running high jump, 440-yard dash, discus throw, one-half mile run, hammer throw, two mile run, running broad jump.

## PITCHING PROBLEM AT THE UNIVERSITY

It Has Become Acute Because of the Series With Virginia.

MORGANTOWN, May 7.—Kemper Shelton, coach of the West Virginia baseball team which completed its annual eastern trip successfully last Saturday, will have a complex pitching problem to solve in connection with the series of three games here Thursday, Friday and Saturday of this week with Virginia. He has just two reliable pitchers who work at that position regularly, namely, Capt. June and Lattener.

In the trip east, after Chenoweth was declared ineligible to play baseball, Shelton had June, Lattener and Carden. Carden was used only in batting practice for the most part, and the one game which he started produced a double, a triple and a home run in short order. Shelton found it necessary, therefore, to break up his batting order and bring Dawson in from the outfield in two of the games. Dawson pitched great baseball and allowed but seven hits in the 14 innings he was on the mound, but Shelton does not think it desirable to break up the batting order and is not decided as to what course he will pursue in the Virginia games which come in rapid succession.

On the eastern trip June pitched against Syracuse on Thursday and Army on Saturday winning both games but should either he or Lattener attempt this against Virginia it would be a difficult assignment. The most likely thing seems to be that Shelton will use June and Lattener for the first two games and should bad weather not interfere with either of these he will send Dawson in the box on Saturday. Dawson has a great amount of "stuff" and has the highest percentage of strike-outs of any of the pitchers.



## THEY'RE FORGETTING WRESTLING IN JAPAN AND WRESTLERS HAVE TAKEN UP BASEBALL

The time-honored sport of Japan is not, as is supposed by most Americans, jiu-jitsu, nor is it karate. Wrestling is the oldest sport in Japan and the members of the profession have clung to old traditions even so far as wearing top-knots, which most Japanese have discarded.

But even the Japanese wrestlers have been unable to withstand the

invasion of baseball and they have formed a number of ball clubs which vie with the Japanese college teams for the championship of the island kingdom. In Japan this is regarded as the first move of the Japs to change their national sport from wrestling to baseball and it is meeting favor with hundreds of thousands of natives.

One of the really famous teams is

the Tokio wrestlers' nine, every member of which is as well known in Japan as Strangler Lewis or Earl Caddock are in America. One member of the nine has declared that next to being the champion wrestler of Japan he would rather be the best baseball player in Nippon, which is some statement, coming from a Japanese wrestler, and goes to show how strong

the great American game is going there.

They have a baseball league of college teams in Japan, including Waseda University, Tokio University, Keio University and Kyoto University. The two first mentioned have toured the United States and have given some good American clubs a race for their money.
