


SAMMY GROWS HIS OWN FOOD

FINANCE, OIL AND GAS

Pittsburgh
PITTSBURGH, June 12.—There was a fair demand for the better class of stocks listed on the local board, and some strong spots were developed in the trading. Pittsburgh Coal common advanced to and closed at 52, a net gain of 3 1/2 per cent, the market here following the revival of interest in the stock on the New York exchange.

There is a falling off in completions in the Eastern oil fields. There is a large amount of work under way and starting, with prospects favorable for a further increase as the summer months advance. The demand for producing territory was never so great and operators are drilling in sections many time rejected in the past.

New York

NEW YORK, June 12.—Trading in stocks yesterday was a trifle more active and diversified than in Monday's insignificant session, but in other essentials the market showed no material changes.

Grain and Produce

CHICAGO, June 12.—Excessively high temperatures in the West brought about a sudden bounce in corn prices in the last hour of trading yesterday. The market closed strong at 2 1/4 to 2 1/2 net advance, with July 1.42 1/4 to 1.45 1/4. Oats gained 2 to 3

On Dents Run, Mannington district, Marion county, West Virginia, the Blackshere Oil and Gas Company has now completed its No 4 on the W S Straight farm. It shows a capacity of 4,000,000 cubic feet of gas a day in the Fifty-foot sand. It will not be drilled deeper at this time.

On State Fork, Mannington district, Marion county, the Manufacturers Light and Heat Company has drilled a second test on the Morgan-Rice farm into the Fifth sand. A fair gas pressure was developed in that formation. Nothing was found in the upper sands.

In Ten Mile district, Harrison county, the Hope Natural Gas Company is due in the Gordon at a test on the Duffer-Sperry farm. In Mannington district, Marion county, the Hope Natural Gas Company is drilling a test on the Charles Straight farm.

In Union district, Harrison county, the Philadelphia Company's No 4 on the Porter Maxwell farm is being drilled through the Fifth sand and it is a light gaser. In the same locality the Hope Natural Gas Company got a fair gaser in the Gordon sand at a second test on the A W Smith farm.

In Center district, Doddridge county, there is considerable new work starting. The Carter Oil Company has the rig completed for a second test

on the J L Young farm. The Philadelphia Company is due in the Big Injun sand at a test on the W J Duncworth farm. After a protracted fishing job the Imperial Oil and Gas Products Company has skidded the rig at No 3 on the Daniel Duckworth farm and it is starting a new hole. No 6 on the same farm has started to drill.

The same company is drilling a second test on the Mary E Dotson farm. The Hope Natural Gas Company is due in the Big Injun sand at a test on the L O and M E Dotson farm. The same company is fishing at its second test on the Henry K Hewitt farm in the sand. The Carnegie Natural Gas Company has started to drill a second test at the Thomas Brennan heirs' farm.

In Greenbrier district the Hope Natural Gas Company has the rig completed for a second test on the M E McClain heirs' farm.

In Walker district, Wood county, the Hope Natural Gas Company has drilled its deep well on the Volcano Coal and Oil Company's tract a little deeper, increasing the show of oil and gas pressure. This is the well that got its oil at a greater depth than any other well ever drilled in this or any other country. In the same district Burke Bros' No 19 on the West Virginia tract is a duster in the Salt sand. The Stockton Oil Company has started to drill a second test on the W W Biele, Jr farm in Greene district, Wetzel county, the Benedum-Trees Oil Company is due in the sand at a test on the I J Cook farm.

James Facemire, one of the Monongah boys to go with the last contingent to Camp Lee, has been made a corporal in one of the training battalions.
