HIS SWEETHEARTS ALL QUICK TO SHOOT Charles Brock in Hospital May Die of Woman's Bullets.

Jealousy, the county officers say, prompted Sarah Jones, a negro, to shoot Charles Brock, colored, last night at 11 o'clock at a house at Hill alley and Quincy street.

From what the officers glean Brock was visiting Lulu Porter, alias "Big Mam," a colored woman, who recently came here from Conellsville, Pa., and who herself attempted to shoot Brock about a year ago and served time in the local jail for the crime.

Mrs. Jones was arrested by Deputy Sheriff J. S. Glover and Assistant Chief of Police Albert Seaman. At the county jail she appeared to care little as to the outcome of the shooting.
