

SUGAR RATION IS NOW THREE POUNDS

Increased Supply and Better Transportation Makes Increase Possible.

Three pounds of sugar per month for each person will hereafter be the allotment for the people of West Virginia for household use and for consumption in public eating places according to a telegram received by E. W. Ogleway, Federal Food Administrator for West Virginia from Herbert Hoover, United States Food Administrator.

The new ruling on sugar does not mean any increase for manufacturing purposes, soft drinks, etc., and only applies to the household and public eating places. Under the former ruling persons were required to buy a fifteen day supply and strictly on the two pound per person per month basis, but under the present ruling persons may buy a full month's supply of sugar.

The Sugar division of the State Food Administration promptly on the first of the month sent out certificates covering the two-pound allotment which was 3,800,000 pounds for this state. New certificates will immediately be issued for the extra pound.




