City League Averages Show Play Is Tightening Up All Around

The City league batting averages printed below show that the various teams of the league are tightening up their defense and it is not so easy to get a hit in the league as it used to be. There is hardly a team in the league which has not made a great improvement in their fielding, resulting in a much stronger defense, and consequently being responsible for the big drop which the demon sluggers of the league have been experiencing in the past three weeks.

Tom Ashcraft, the demon slugger of the Watson building team, continues to lead the league. Ashcraft has been to bat just thirty-six times and has made eighteen hits, a percentage of .500. In Herbert Barnes, of the West Virginian nine, and Gall Boice, of the B. & O. team, Ashcraft is finding strong competitors and will have to continue his hard hitting if he wants his name at the top of the batting list.

Morgan, Busam and Burns are the first three in the individual batting averages, but they have not been in a sufficient number of games rightfully to lead the league. The most sensational individual batting in the league during the past three weeks has been done by Burns, the big Monongah Glass pitcher-short stop, who has been at bat 11 times and made 7 hits.

Club Fielding. The Monongah Glass leads all other teams of the league in fielding, that team having accepted 360 chances and made but twenty-nine errors.

The Mining Machine team is second in fielding and the Watson building third.

In the club batting averages, the Watson building is first, the Monongah Glass second and the B. & O. third. Shanasky Best Thief.

Shanasky, of the Wholesalers, is the best base thief in the league, having stole a total of ten bases since the opening of the league. Jacobs of the Watson building comes second with nine stolen bases and Bus Aldridge, of the Monongah Glass, third with eight stolen bases.
