Report on Sunday Baseball Will Also Come Up It Is Expected.



Lace Patterns-- a New Design Every Week

- Chain Stitches. The thread drawn through the loop.
- Open Mesh—A double crochet into a chain or the material. Two chain stitches and a double crochet.
- Closed Mesh—Four double crochet stitches into a chain or material.
- Turn—Five chain stitches to turn. If your pattern called for 16 stitches—chain 21 and double crochet into the seventh stitch from the needle.
- Four-leaf Clover in Filet.
- This pattern is effective in pieces for bedroom or living room if worked with heavy thread.
- Chain 46 stitches and turn.
- First row—Three open meshes, 3 closed meshes, 9 open meshes and turn.
- Second row—Twelve open meshes, 1 closed mesh, 2 open meshes and turn.
- Third row—One open mesh, 1 closed mesh, 13 open meshes and turn.
- Fourth row—Three open meshes, 2



- closed meshes, 2 open meshes, 3 closed meshes, 3 open meshes, 1 closed mesh, 1 open mesh and turn.
- Fifth row—One open mesh, 1 closed mesh, 1 open mesh, 5 closed meshes, 1 open mesh, 4 closed meshes, 2 open meshes and turn.
- Sixth row—One open mesh, 5 closed meshes, 1 open mesh, 1 closed mesh, 1 open mesh and turn.
- Seventh row—One open mesh, 1 closed mesh, 1 open mesh, 5 closed meshes, 1 open mesh, 5 closed meshes, 1 open mesh and turn.
- Eighth row—Two open meshes, 4 closed meshes, 1 open mesh, 4 closed meshes, 1 open mesh, 1 closed mesh, 2 open meshes and turn.
- Ninth row—Fifteen open meshes.
- Tenth row—Two open meshes, 5 closed meshes, 1 open mesh, 4 closed meshes, 3 open meshes and turn.
- Eleventh row—Two open meshes, 5 closed meshes, 1 open mesh, 5 closed meshes, 2 open meshes and turn.
- Twelfth and 13th rows—Same as 11th row.
- Fourteenth row—Four open meshes, 3 closed meshes, 2 open meshes, 2 closed meshes, 4 open meshes and turn.
- Fifteenth row—Nine open meshes, 2 closed meshes, 4 open meshes and turn.
- Sixteenth, 17th and 18th rows—Same as 9th row.
- Nineteenth row—Same as 1st row, etc.


Mrs. David S. Kendall to Be Buried Sunday

IDA MAY BAD MAN TAKEN TO HOSPITAL

George Gibson However Is Not As Bad As He Was.

George Gibson, of Ida May, was taken to Fairmont hospital this morning from the county jail where he was lodged yesterday charged with shooting to wound Robert Pratt, colored, also of Ida May. Gibson also shot himself in the leg.

The shooting occurred yesterday while Gibson was showing the natives what a bad combination pickhandle, moonshine whiskey and a gun can make, in which demonstration he succeeded beyond his wildest dreams. This morning he doesn't remember how it happened but admits that it was all his fault.

Eye-witnesses say that Pratt was walking about the street, when Gibson opened fire, shooting five times one bullet striking Pratt in the leg. Gibson is said to have then tried to reload the automatic, in which act he was successful in shooting himself in the calf of the leg.

Sheriff Glover and Deputy Sheriff James Barrett made a record run of twenty-five minutes to Ida May and arrested Gibson.
