The stage settings and costumes at all times present a spectacle that is pleasing to the eye and quickly puts the audience in a receptive mood. Bobby Shinn, Jr., stage director, keeps every one on the stage pretty busy and on the jump. Sometimes we scarcely understand his requests or commands rather, for his every request is a command for every member of the company, but there is a sweet faced lady with coal black hair that understands every word he says, and is usually near him. 


