FARM PRODUCTS SLUMP. WASHINGTON, July 25.—The purchasing power, or exchange value of farm products slumped four points between March and June to 72 per cent of the 1913 basis in the latter month according to statistics made public today by the Department of Agriculture.

The buying power of farm products in terms of other products stood at 76 per cent in March having advanced from 65 per cent in January, which was a rise of three points over the low mark touched in November, 1921.

Millan, President of the County Court of Marion County, West Virginia, do hereby proclaim and appoint Tuesday, the 1st day of August, 1922, between the hours of sunrise and sunset of that day, at the regular established voting places of said County of Marion, State of West Virginia, as the time and place at which a special election, provided for in said order of the County Court, shall be held by the qualified voters of said County to decide whether or not they will authorize the County Court of said Marion County, West Virginia, to lay a levy of three (.03) cents on every \$100.00 of valuation of the taxable property in the County, according to the last assessment thereof, to pay the expense and cost of the establishing and maintaining Dental Clinics as provided by Chapter 176 of the Acts of the Legislature of 1922.
