ORDINANCE NO. 65. Passed by the Board of Directors July 24, 1922. AN ORDINANCE. To amend and re-enact Section 18 of Ordinance No. 53, passed December 13, 1921, commonly called the "Milk Ordinance."

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE CITY OF FAIRMONT, that that section 18 of that certain ordinance No. 53, passed December 13, 1921, commonly called the "Milk Ordinance" of said City, be amended and re-enacted so as to read as follows: SALE OF MILK IN BOTTLES. That section 18 of that certain ordinance No. 53, passed December 13, 1921, commonly called the "Milk Ordinance" of said City, be amended and re-enacted so as to read as follows: SALE OF MILK IN BOTTLES. Milk or cream shall not be transferred by or operated on in any way, except to be sold in approved by the City Health Officer and shall have a temperature of not higher than 60 degrees Fahrenheit, and no milk or cream in partly filled bottles shall be sold or offered for sale and not bottles or containers shall be filled, capped or re-capped outside the bottling room or dairy used for bottling milk, except to be sold in quantities of one gallon or more at one time tightly sealed cans for cookery purposes only. In case it is desired to sell milk in cans in less than one gallon quantities for any purpose whatever, written permission shall be obtained from the City Health Officer.

NO DIP MILK. Milk or cream shall not be transferred by or operated on in any way, except to be sold in approved by the City Health Officer and shall have a temperature of not higher than 60 degrees Fahrenheit, and no milk or cream in partly filled bottles shall be sold or offered for sale and not bottles or containers shall be filled, capped or re-capped outside the bottling room or dairy used for bottling milk, except to be sold in quantities of one gallon or more at one time tightly sealed cans for cookery purposes only. In case it is desired to sell milk in cans in less than one gallon quantities for any purpose whatever, written permission shall be obtained from the City Health Officer.

SERVICE IN ORIGINAL BOTTLES. HOTELS, RESTAURANTS, ETC. Milk served in hotels or restaurants or any other public place for human consumption must be served in the original bottle in which it was delivered. Hotels, restaurants and other such eating places shall not be required to secure permits under this ordinance for the sale of milk to be consumed on the premises, but all other provisions of this ordinance shall be applicable thereto.

SERVICE AT SODA FOUNTAINS, ETC. Notwithstanding anything in this section contained, it shall be lawful to serve buttermilk at soda fountains and other like places by pouring the same from a bottle or container into the glass from which the same is consumed, provided that the facilities employed are of a sanitary type and care is taken at all times to keep the milk in good wholesome condition in accordance with the provisions of this ordinance. But no person shall be served buttermilk as specified in this paragraph until and unless the City Health Officer has approved the same, and shall have issued a written permit to the person authorized to serve. Such permit shall be revocable at any time by the City Health Officer for a failure to observe the reasonable sanitary requirements of said officer, and the provisions of this section of milk shall be governed by the other provisions of this section.
