

VILLA ABOUT 50 MILES AHEAD OF PURSUING TROOPS

Believed to Be Headed for San Andres, 25 Miles Southwest of Chihuahua City.

El Paso, March 28.—Dispatches from the front, intercepted in connection with the news brought by Americans returning from different points in the interior of Chihuahua, caused a belief here to-night that Francisco Villa was headed for San Andres, about 25 miles southwest of Chihuahua City, a favorite headquarters of the bandit.

There are several Americans in El Paso who are not only thoroughly familiar with the country through which Villa is feeling, but who were also well acquainted with the bandit chief in former days.

It is thought to be already not less than 50 miles ahead of his pursuers and possibly leading the chase a much greater distance.

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METHODIST CONFERENCE

Bishop Hamilton Gives Communion to 150—Senator Dillingham to Speak—Memorial Service Held.

Montpelier, March 29.—Bishop John W. Hamilton of Boston, who is to retire this year because of the age limit which he has reached, presided over the opening session of the 72nd annual Vermont Methodist conference, this morning in Trinity Church and administered communion to 150 persons.

At the morning session the following officers were elected to serve throughout the conference and ministers made detailed reports of their year's work.

The Rev. W. S. Smithers presided at the afternoon session, which was given over to memorial service, the memorial sermon, and the election of members of the conference who died during the year.

This evening the Rev. Patrick Joseph Maveety, D. D., of Cincinnati, Ohio, delivered an address at the Freedman's Aid anniversary.

In connection with the conference a meeting of the Laymen's association and an electoral conference will be held Friday and Saturday in Bethany Church.

Senator William B. Dillingham, president of the Laymen's association, is down for a brief address at the opening session.

Others who are to make addresses are the Rev. A. W. Hewitt of Plainfield, superintendent of the State board of education, and the Hon. Frank Plimney of Northfield.

DESPONDENT, TOOK LIFE.

Ansel Kelsey, 68, Farmer, Blew Off Top of His Head.

Middlebury, March 29.—Ansel Kelsey, aged 68 years, killed himself with a shotgun about one o'clock this afternoon at the home of his daughter, Mrs. K. J. Piper, two miles north of the village.

Mr. Kelsey drove this morning to the home of his daughter, hitched his horse back of the house, and after talking with his daughter told her he would go out to feed the horse.

His son, John Kelsey, who until a few days ago lived with his parents on the farm, had moved into Middlebury as he had a position with the Champlain Valley Telephone company.

an hour, second No. 86 following, being partly an express train with the Detroit Cleveland sleepers, collided with the first section.

The rear car of first No. 86, which contained all of the passengers who were either killed or seriously injured, was a modern solid steel coach.

"At 2:00 p. m. to-day investigation indicates there were twenty-six fatalities consisting of twenty-four passengers and two employes, all of whom were in the derailed coach, except one Pullman conductor in the club car.

"Investigation as to responsibility involves several employes, some of whom were injured and have not yet been interviewed and no statement can be made as to responsibility until complete investigation has been made, which will be made as soon as the condition of the employes will permit and the facts are known.

The one hope at present is that the American engineers may be able to catch up with Villa before he gets much further south.

reasonable and that the government had met nearly all his wishes, while other suggestions he had made were still under consideration.

The despatch to the state department do not make it clear whether all the members of the Englishman's crew were removed before the vessel was torpedoed, and additional information on that point is being sought.

Mr. Long paid an eloquent tribute to the men under 35 years of age who had volunteered for military service.

After explaining that the calling up of the men under 35 years of age would release a large number of men for foreign service, he proceeded to outline the government's proposals for dealing with hardships arising through the enlistment of married men.

Mr. Long said that everything that could be done would be done to get the greatest number of single men and reduce the pecuniary and other burdens on the enlisted married men.
