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### A FAILURE.

A year ago to-day a cloud of sadness passed over our usually prosperous city. A black eye was given to our merchandising institutions, by the announcement of the failure of the only bank in the Yellowstone valley, and the largest merchandising concern in Miles City, viz: A. R. Ninger & Co., and the Bank of Miles City. At first it was thought to be but a temporary suspension, though as time wore on each developments made more clear the real condition of affairs, until by litigation both concerns have ceased to exist.

The Miles City Sunday schools are being well attended just now, and the classes are well filled, keeping the teachers busy explaining the different chapters of the catechism and bible. England was visited yesterday by a severe snow storm, and railroad travel was almost entirely suspended. One train of cars became buried in a snow drift, in which position they remained all night.

It is reported that the western bound mail over the Northern Pacific railroad missed connection at Bismarck yesterday. If there is any truth in the rumor, we will be minus our eastern mail to-day.

The abduction and cruel murder of Morgan, many years ago, has been brought to the surface again by the death of Thurlow Weed. This might be a good time to make inquiries regarding the body of A. T. Stewart and the hitting of William Patterson, Esq.

Col. Pat. Donan, the gifted man who abandoned the journalistic field to engage in speculation in corner lots and brown stone front residences, has just interviewed a genuine Dakota blizzard. He says the next one blowing around his way, he proposes taking to the woods.

There is another William Patterson that deserves to be struck with a heavily laden club. He emptied the contents of his revolver into a crowd in Cincinnati yesterday and killed a hack driver who was aiding him in trying to raise a kind of Donnybrook fair fight. Mr. Patterson's chances of defeating Brave Bear in his recent rope act are very flattering.

Thursday was without any doubts the coldest day we have yet had the present winter. At midnight the thermometer registered forty-seven degrees below zero. At Brainerd, Minn., it was 18 below, at Fargo, D. T., 37 below, at Grand Forks 31 below.

The harbor at Chicago became entirely frozen over yesterday. Many vessels, unable to make port, were hemmed in by the ice, where they must remain for some time. This cold snap has found the shipping interests in the northwest wholly unprepared for it, and the losses will be simply enormous.

The custom of allowing steamboat captains to run their boats like silly boys with livery horses, should have been abolished many years ago. It seems, however, that at least two men were hiding when the fool killer passed their way, for yesterday an explosion occurred on a racing steamer, by which fifteen lives were lost.
