A new town has been laid out at Tonston's ferry.

Five hogs butchered at Bozeman averaged 436 pounds.

A barn was burned to the ground in Helena Friday night, by fire from the pipes of tramps.

The new Western Union telegraph line between Helena and Deer Lodge is nearly completed.

A prospect mill is to be erected in Lincoln, Deer Lodge county, by the Providence mining company.

The Helena *Herald* says the Chollar mine, at Maiden, has been sold to Mr. Eaton, of Omaha, for \$80,000.

The Hope mining company at Philipsburg has declared a quarterly dividend of \$3 per share, amounting to \$34,000.

Tri-weekly mail service between Martinsdale and Billings has gone into effect, coaches and stock having been strung along the line.

The *Inter Mountains Freeman* says: According to the vote cast in this city at the recent election, Butte has a population of "87,000."

When the time arrives that iron mines can be successfully worked in Montana, the immense leads in the Castle mountains will prove of great value.

All the Northern Pacific topographical survey parties (three) have now come in, having adjourned till spring. The three parties have, during the past summer and fall, examined between eighty and ninety townships, aggregating between fifteen hundred thousand and two million acres of land, each forty-acre tract of which they can give an accurate description of.


