THE PROTECTED LOAN SCHEME.

You Can Get a Cash Advance Right Off If You Comply with Preliminaries.

One of the greatest problems that has for years confronted people who have spare cash and a willingness "to oblige a friend with a loan" is to accommodate the worthy borrower, and, on the other hand, get rid of the nuisance who never repays anything.

It is a co-operative scheme somewhat similar in its workings to the system upon which building and loan associations are conducted, and its benefits are greatest to clerks and others of somewhat limited income who may enter into the plan.

Each member agreed to pay five cents a week premium upon every dollar advanced when he found it necessary to borrow. For this he gave his personal note to the treasurer, agreeing that the loan should not run longer than six weeks.

The plan was a success from the start and the membership steadily increased. Men in the association were spared applications for loans when it might be inconvenient to advance them and distasteful to decline by being able to refer the applicant to the treasurer of the association.

The great value of the scheme over and above everything else, however, was the manner in which the treasurer was able effectually to get rid of a chronic borrower, who sought to avail himself of the privileges of the association. One of the rules stipulated that not more than one loan could be made to an applicant at any one time, and that in order to be accommodated again the first loan must be paid, together with whatever interest might be due on it.

"This interest, as you call it," exclaimed the treasurer, "is shared among all of us and goes toward vacation money. The man who would object to paying it can't be much good."

The scheme can be made more profitable still to investors in the protected loan association if the means of the members enable them to put in \$5 weekly instead of \$1. The association is, of course, protected against loss by the privilege of suing on the personal note of any borrower. But it is claimed by enthusiasts on the subject that nobody ever succeeds in imposing upon the treasury. The right to reject applications of rather shady reputation in the matter of repaying loans is an effectual barrier, they say, against such borrowers.
