NEWS of the STATE



45,052 Ablebodied Men.

Montana has available for military duty 45,052 ablebodied men, according to the biennial report of Adjutant General Phil Greenan to Governor Norris. The enrolled strength of the National guard of this state consists of one regiment of infantry of 12 companies, with a total of 762 men.

Hit By Passenger Train.

William Mathers Green, a civil and construction engineer in the employ of the Milwaukee railway, was struck by westbound train No. 17, Tuesday about noon and instantly killed. The accident happened near the noon hour at Kohrs, a siding six miles west of Deer Lodge.

Two inoffensive looking little boys John Karraffa and Andrew Sabol, were brought into Sheriff Collins' office for investigation under a charge filed against them by officers of the Great Northern railway.

It is alleged that the boys were responsible for the derailing of a number of freight cars in the Stockett yards a couple weeks ago which required the services of the wrecking outfit for a whole day to straighten out.

A defective flue came very near causing a disastrous fire at Eureka last week in the Zook building recently remodeled after the fire last year and was to be used as a dining room for the Eureka hotel. Quick work on the part of the Volunteer firemen saved the structure from much damage except by water.
