The Local Roundup.

Wm. Bundy went to Helena last Friday on business, returning Wednesday.

Clyde Otto of Canton, S. D., was in town Tuesday looking over our city with a view of locating.

Frank Philippe is at his former position as clerk in Schrupp's store, after a short intermission.

Right Harvey, a rancher from down the river near Musselshell crossing, was a visitor here Wednesday.

Christ Jensvold arrived here last week from Baltic, S. D., to establish residence on his homestead north of here.

The large hoisting engine for the Republic Coal Co. arrived this week. The new machinery is being installed as rapidly as possible.

T. O. Ramsland of the Western Townsite Co. with headquarters at Terry, Mont., was here yesterday with several prospective lot buyers.

The store building of P. J. Callahan, north of The Record office is rapidly nearing completion and will be ready for occupancy in a week or so.

Robinson & Martin are putting up a new building on Railway Ave. and First street east which will be the permanent home of "The Silver Dollar."

C. J. Manuel, the head blacksmith of the Republic mine, moved into his new residence on First street east the fore part of this week with his family.

Ray Brothers have moved their building "The Miner" and in its place are putting up a 20x40 structure facing Railway Avenue and First Street.

Mrs. Thomas Smith and family arrived here this week from Missouri to join Mr. Smith, the mail stage driver between Musselshell and Roundup.

J. W. Frazer is erecting a 16x36 building on First street east in which he will start a bakery and confectionery. He expects to be doing business in about a week or ten days.

A. A. Newgard, a hardware man from Mandan, N. D., was here several days this week looking up a location. He left again Tuesday feeling very favorably impressed with Roundup.

The regulars and a scrub nine had a set-to Sunday afternoon resulting in a score somewhat favorable to the regulars. Our commiseration for the scrubs prevents us from publishing the figures.

Loney & Dance are building an addition to their restaurant and when completed will be better able to take care of their increasing patronage. On Tuesday of this week they served 207 people for dinner alone.

G. W. Handel and Geo. Bachman of Musselshell were in town Wednesday going to and returning from the meeting of the directors of the Billings-Musselshell Telephone Co. at Old Roundup Wednesday afternoon.

J. C. Lohman, who is opening a general store directly across the street from The Record office, returned Tuesday from White Sulphur Springs where he was formerly located in business. He expects his stock of goods in a few days and will be doing business in a short time.

Work was commenced last week on the erection of a temporary school house on lot seven and block seven in the western part of town. The building is to be 16x24 and will have room enough to seat 36 pupils. It is hoped to have it ready for the opening of school next Monday, April 13. Geo. R. Barnes has the contract of putting up the building and furnishing the interior.

Immigrants are already pouring into this part of Montana in a steady stream. The fore part of this week several cars arrived here from Canton, S. D., containing the effects of Wm. Opperud, Geo. Torgerson, Don Holden and A. J. Wilson, who will at once take up their residence on their homesteads near here. These South Dakotans are a fine class of people and this country is fortunate in being able to acquire them as permanent residents.

The Midland Coal & Lumber Co. of Miles City is opening up a yard at this point having received eight cars of lumber this week. They will have their sheds on the three lots just north of the Montana Lumber Co. F. A. Appelman will have charge of the business here.

Roundup is fortunate in having such an accommodating and obliging station agent as A. H. Davies. He is being almost deluged with freight every day compelling him and his estimable wife to work like Trojans in arranging things so business men can secure their shipments speedily.

A. J. Wilson arrived here Tuesday from Canton, S. D., with a carload of household goods and is now getting his residence on his claim in readiness preparatory to moving. Mr. Wilson has an excellent 160 acres in Sec. 20, 9-15, where he will be joined by his wife in about a month to share in the joys of living on a Montana homestead.

D. P. Mumbroe, who has been furnishing ties for the C. M. & St. P. coast extension thru this section, left with his wife Wednesday for Honolulu. Mr. Mumbroe expects to bid on a large tie contract with the Southern Pacific who have been experimenting with timber from the Sandwich Islands for that purpose with favorable results.

While at Old Roundup Wednesday we had the pleasure of meeting Deputy Sheriff J. L. Fisco, Charles Guy and Magnus Lindstrand who figured very prominently in the late tragedy resulting in the killing of the horse thief Bickford. Deputy Fisco was the first to find and take the trail of the slayer of Sheriff Webb dogging him out of the hills into the open thus making his escape almost impossible. Mr. Guy was with the posse who corralled Bickford in the sheep wagon and was the first one to go up to the wagon after it was riddled with bullets finding the horse thief dead. Mr. Guy, as one of the five who secured the body of Bickford will come in for one-fifth of the reward of \$3,000 which had been offered for his capture dead or alive.
