THE GREATEST IN HISTORY. (Record Special.) Secretary of Agriculture Wilson makes the statement that "the total value of farm production for 1912 will be over \$9,000,000,000, the largest agricultural yield in the history of the country. That looks like prosperity. The total value of 1911 farm products was \$8,417,000,000 as compared with \$8,594,000,000 in 1910." The figures are for farm products of all kinds, including animals.

The American potato crop this year will total 401,000,000 bushels, as compared with a crop of 293,000,000 last year. New England railroads started in this week to advance car rates for transporting the bumper Maine potato crop, by increasing the cost of the "cheater car" service. The Interstate Commerce Commission promptly forbade any raise in present rates.


