A Question of the Day.

One of the advantages the fair city of Bozeman enjoys is easy access to pure and cold water. The West Gallatin flows on the north, the East Gallatin on the north, Bozeman Creek through the heart of the city, and the whole surface of the plain is checked by ditches of rippling water fresh from the spring and melting snows of the foot-hills and mountains. Also within a two hour's ride is Mystic Lake, whose limpid waters but wait the deft hand of man with the appliances of genius to tap its clear cold depths for all the aqueous element necessary to supply the wants of any city west of the Mississippi. Here is an inviting field for capital and enterprise. Under our charter the city could not be bonded to provide for the work of supplying the municipality with water from this source, so the time is opportune for individual or corporate enterprise to take the initiative. A company of our citizens should be organized to take hold of this prize before it shall slip from their grasp into the hands of eastern investors who may see farther into the future than those who have been long in this field, but have not given the scheme a second thought. He is not a visionary who foresees that water works will soon be a necessity, and blind must be the business man or the taxpayer who fails to see that if we had a supply of water from Mystic Lake, it would come with such pressure as would require no expensive engines to fight fire in the city. With a supply of water from this elevated source only hydrants and hose would be required to contend successfully against the fire fiend, and thus a great expense would be saved.

The insurance rate would be greatly reduced and no extra expense incurred in buying expensive engines such as add to the burden of the taxpayers in cities less favored by nature with an alluvial reservoir. Since Butte secured a water supply from above the city, the corporation has discarded the use of engines and reaped a revenue from their sale. The report of the Fire Marshal of Helena, proves what an expensive luxury an elaborate fire organization is. It requires a page and a half of the Herald for the marshal to tell the public how the machinery was worked. Such pressure as could be secured from Mystic Lake would reduce any fire in our city, simply by the application of hose to the fire plugs, and to accomplish this, but few men would be required as compared with cities where mechanical appliances are used. In addition to fire facilities of this character which the municipality would only be too glad to pay liberally for, would be the demand for street sprinkling in the summer, irrigating trees on the street line, the needs of individual consumers at their places of business, including manufacturers and mills, and for all domestic purposes. In fact it is patent to the most casual observer that the present demand of the city would warrant a thorough investigation of this whole subject with an eye single to business. The exigencies of the incipient period of corporate life in an old conservative and prosperous city, demands that something should be done at an early day for fire protection. We have withstood the perils of fire long enough. That fortune has favored us in the past is no guarantee that it will in the future. Conditions are rapidly changing in this community and we should be prepared to meet them. The best thing the city can do is to investigate these new questions and encourage the investment of capital in enterprises for the public. The question of water works or some sort of fire protection is one of the exigencies of the times and corporate organization for individual investment may lead the way.
