NOTICE TO SUBSCRIBERS

A recent ruling of the postoffice department prohibits the mailing of newspapers at second class rates to subscribers who are more than one year in arrears. Of course, being in but our third year of existence, this ruling will not work as great a hardship with us as with older papers, but still there are quite a few subscribers who are more or less in arrears. If such is the case, see that your subscription is paid before the expiration of three months, the time allowed publishers to bring their lists up to date, or of necessity your name will be dropped from our list.

It is encouraging to learn from the statement of the Secretary of Commerce and Labor that there is already enough law on the statute books to deal very largely with the problem of anarchy in this country simply by enforcing the present laws and without waiting for fresh legislation. It is almost a waste of time to refer to the senselessness of the anarchist's creed or to the menace that he is to society. It has been proved only too often that forbearance is not a virtue that he appreciates. He is as irresponsible as any other lunatic and there is never any telling the next point at which he is going to break out. Americans are a long suffering people and too apt to pass lightly over crime of all sorts. But the anarchist with his crazy doctrines has shown in the past few years that nobody is safe from him from the President in the White House to the priest at the altar. The time has come to deal with him swiftly and harshly. Where it is possible to deport him, that action should be satisfactory to this country, but where it is not, life imprisonment on conviction is none too drastic a method of removing him from the temptation of senseless murder. Secretary Straus says that the police do not seem to appreciate the fact that there is already a sufficient law against alien anarchists. They are excluded from the country along with habitual criminals and persons convicted of crimes involving moral turpitude. They can be picked up at any time within three years of their entry to this country and summarily deported to the land whence they came. The police are now waking up to the existence of this law and it is being brought to their attention by the immigration inspectors under special orders of the Secretary of Commerce and Labor. Already several arrests have been made under this law and municipalities all over the country are taking notice of its possibilities. The local police in every city know their own alien anarchists and habitual criminals and in the present crusade they have an excellent chance to get rid of them by turning them over to the immigration authorities. Perhaps in time we will get the life imprisonment law for anarchists too.

Parents the country over must mourn and sympathize with the scores of families bereaved through the awful disaster when the Collinwood public school was burned. The lesson of the matter is that the same thing may happen in any community at any time and no expense is too great and no precaution too elaborate to prevent it. This is a rich country and if ground never be a school house built more than two stories high. One would be better. Construction should be fireproof to the last degree and fire patrol should be kept up as constantly as on the stage of a theatre. The result would be well worth the expense.

BOLD HOLDUP

Jack Katakai of the Nippon Restaurant had a close call for his life when he returned to his residence on River Street last Monday evening, accompanied by one of his employees. Hardly had he opened the door of the house when a pistol was shoved into his face, and he was commanded to "stand and deliver." Katakai, however, instead of complying, jerked forth his own gun and a fusillade followed, after which the miscreants, said by Katakai to be three in number, made their escape.

Local officers at once commenced a roundup of suspicious characters. Next day a man giving the name of Cecil Self was arrested over the Turf Exchange, it being discovered that he had been shot through the hips, although not seriously. He shortly confessed to being one of the men wanted, and in searching him several articles were found which had been pilfered in the burglary of the Rivenes-Wester store last week, so that it is reasonably certain that he was also connected with the latter job. The prisoner maintains, however, that he does not know the names of the other parties concerned in Monday night's escapade, but can identify them if they are brought before him.

Meanwhile the officers are reasonably certain that they have the right men under lock and key, and they propose to sift the matter thoroughly.
